Minnesota Governor Proposes \$982M Infrastructure Plan

Minnesota Governor Tim Walz proposed \$982-million of project funding as part of the administration's 2024 Infrastructure Plan that will be presented to the state legislature at the next session.

The governor's recommendations include improvements to water infrastructure, housing, public safety and the maintenance and repair of state buildings and facilities, such as:

- \$166.5 million Rural road safety, regionally significant and trunk highway improvement projects, as well as grants to federally recognize Native American tribes;
- \$160 million Replacement and rehabilitation of statewide local bridges, as well as professional services, maintenance, rehabilitation, stabilization or relocation of salvageable parts from historic bridges;
- \$128 million Maintenance, repair and construction for the state's Corrections assets;
- \$119 million For grants and low-interest loans for lead water pipe replacement and other clean water projects;
- \$103 million Preservation would focus on health, safety, accessibility, mechanical, utility infrastructure and building envelope systems at University of Minnesota campuses;
- \$97 million Housing construction and other related initiatives;
- \$81.8 million Exterior updates, HVAC and safety features at Minnesota higher education facilities;
- \$71.6 million Buildings, roads, trails, bridges and other Department of Natural Resources infrastructure;
- \$48 million Land acquisition, design, construction and equipment for a new Bureau of Criminal Apprehension regional office and laboratory in Mankato;
- \$38.7 million Phase III design and construction for security improvements and upgrades at the Capitol Complex in St. Paul, including installation of bollards and projectile-resistant glass, new lighting, security kiosks, window well security devices and driveway intrusion protection; and
- \$37 million Design, environmental work, acquisition of right-of-way, engineering and construction along regional busway corridors.

In December 2022, Minnesota lawmakers approved \$500-million to upgrade and modernize the State Office Building in St. Paul. The building is 91 years old and requires a complete overhaul.

When the project is complete, the eight-level building will increase in size by 160,000-square-feet, with the state's House of Representatives occupying most of the total space --- more than 126,000-square-feet.

TIPS & TRICKS: Clear that Cookie Cache

Have you ever tried logging in to the Online Plan Room only to be shown an error message even though *you know* you're entering the correct username and password?

This happens from time to time for our members, and fortunately, the fix is a simple one: clear your internet browser's cache and cookies.

What are cookies when it comes to the internet?

Cookies are one type of data your browser saves on your computer or device when you visit a website. Cookies are small text files that store information about your browsing activity, such as your login details, preferences, and history. Cookies help the website recognize you and customize your experience, such as showing you relevant ads, remembering your language settings, and keeping you logged in.

One side effect of cookies is that they can slow down your browser, take up storage space, and compromise your privacy. This can happen when your cache and/or cookies become outdated, corrupted, or overloaded, or when they contain sensitive or personal information that can be accessed by third parties or hackers.

How can I clear my cache and cookies?

The process of clearing your browser cache and cookies may differ slightly depending on the browser you use, such as Chrome (recommended by MBEX), Firefox, Safari, or Edge. Generally, the steps are similar.

To clear your cache and cookies on a Windows PC:

- 1.) Open your browser and click the menu icon (typically three dots or lines) in the top right corner.
- 2.) Select "Settings" or "Options" from the drop-down menu, then find the section labeled "Privacy and Security" or "History".
- 3.) Click on "Clear Browsing Data," "Clear History," or "Manage Data" and choose the desired time range like "Last Hour," "Last Day," "Last Week," or "All Time."
- 4.) Finally, check the boxes for "Cached Images and Files" and "Cookies and Other Site Data" before clicking "Clear Data," "Clear Now," or "Delete."

Construction Backlog Indicator Inches Higher in December

Associated Builders and Contractors reported on January 16, 2024, that its Construction Backlog Indicator increased to 8.6 months in December from 8.5 months in November, according to an ABC member survey conducted December 20, 2023 - January 4, 2024.

The reading is down 0.6 months from December 2022.

The South, which remains the region with the lengthiest backlog, posted the largest monthly increase in December. Only the West, which historically reports the lowest backlog of any region, experienced a monthly decline.

ABC's Construction Confidence Index readings for sales, profit margins and staffing levels increased in December. All three readings remain above the threshold of 50, indicating expectations for growth over the next six months.

"Collectively, contractors experienced an uptick in optimism during the holiday season," said ABC Chief Economist Anirban Basu.

Minnesota, Wisconsin get \$1B in Federal Funding for Aging Blatnik Bridge

Wisconsin and Minnesota will receive more than \$1.05-billion to replace the John A. Blatnik Bridge between Duluth and Superior, according to an announcement from U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin. MnDOT and WisDOT are leading an effort to replace the bridge's aging superstructure, with hopes to start construction in 2027. In December, governors of both states requested funding from federal transportation officials to keep the flow of goods going between Superior, Wis. and Duluth, Minn. (*The Daily Reporter*)

CODES + STANDARDS: ELECTRICAL

Approvals for Prefab Electrical Installations: Authorities Having Jurisdiction Play Critical Roles

Prefabrication is becoming more popular for electrical contractors as an effective way to improve quality control and worker safety while remaining competitive in electrical construction. Section 110.2 addresses approvals generally and applies to equipment and systems covered by the *National Electrical Code (NEC)*. From a practical perspective, one could surmise that on-site and remote prefabrication is already covered in the

approval requirements. This is a valid assumption. However, challenges and inconsistencies do exist, as the term "prefabrication" is not yet mentioned in the *NEC*. (*Electrical Contractor*)

SUSTAINABILITY

☐ Minn. Tribe Builds First-of-Its-Kind Manufacturing Facility for Game-Changing Building Materials

Grist reported that the Lower Sioux, who are part of the Mdewakanton Band of Dakota, are building a 20,000-square-foot campus (expected to be completed in April) that will help the tribe regain some of its sovereignty and facilitate the construction of houses from hempcrete, a sustainable material made from lime, water, and hemp. The facility will be the only one stateside involved in the growth of the hemp, the production of the hempcrete, and the building of the houses. Unlike the harvesting or production of other building materials like wood or concrete --- the latter of which is responsible for 8% of carbon pollution globally --- the cultivation of hemp is eco-friendly. ROAD, CONCRETE + ASPHALT EQUIPMENT

□ 'World's First' Autonomous Pothole Repair System Unveiled

Following successful proof of concept testing, the Autonomous Road Repairs System (ARRES), is now being prepared to undertake real-world testing on the roads of Hertfordshire in Southern England. Officially called ARRES PREVENT, the machine will harness a combination of AI and advanced imaging technology to identify and characterize cracks and potholes on road surfaces. Once detected, it autonomously fills the cracks to prevent surface water ingress and subsequently the formation of potholes. (Construction Briefing)

2024 FORECAST

Large Renovation Projects will be Abundant in 2024

In past years, it was likely more difficult to categorize renovation and repair projects as highly attractive. That may not be the case anymore. Public entities throughout the U.S. are designing extremely large renovation projects, and without a doubt, these upcoming projects will be attractive to firms of all types and sizes. Repair and maintenance costs related to public assets and government facilities represent a substantial proportion of government spending. A decade ago, government officials spent 55% of all infrastructure funding on maintenance and repair. Now, however, more than 60% of the total funding is spent on repairs, renovation, and upkeep. That represents billions of dollars each year that will be spent on large projects such as the ones described in this column. (Construction Citizen)

In a deal worth more than \$2.7-million, Kinseth Hospitality Cos. has sold land in Duluth to D & D Real Estate Holdings, according to public documents.
